What's happening in your community? We asked you last week to research an issue you care about. This could have been anything from knife crime to delivering care packages to those in isolation.

This week, we want you to try and put together a 5 point plan of action for things that you could do to help tackle this issue. To help, we have put some ideas below from social action projects that our students have run previously.

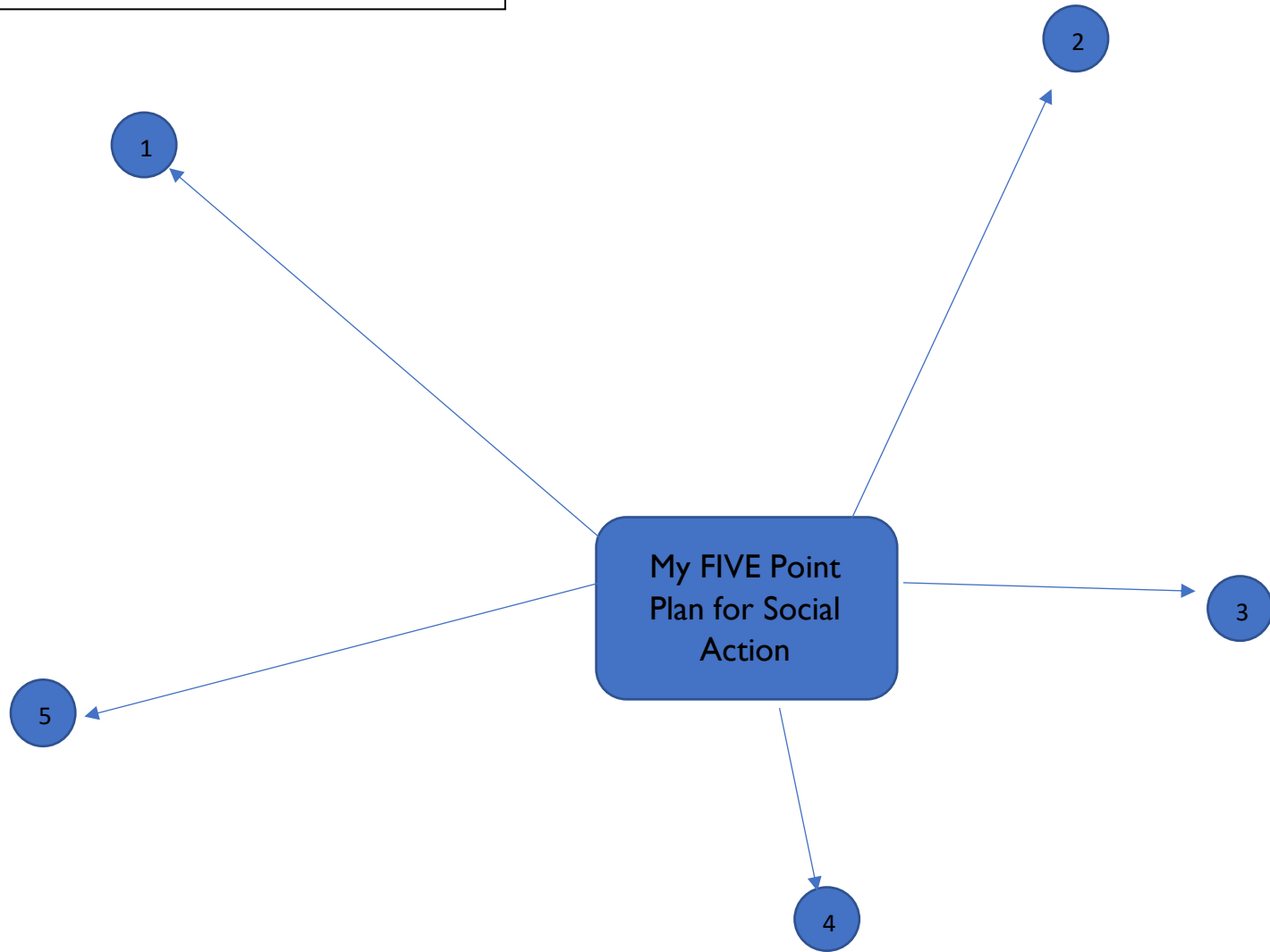
- Designed a logo and slogan that can be used for your campaign.
- Designed a survey and asked people to complete it online.
- Planned fundraising activities.
- Developed posters to raise awareness of an issue.
- Made social media campaigns to help raise awareness of an issue.
- Written letters to people (like headteachers, local MPs, business owners) to help persuade them to do something to help tackle an issue.
- Planned events such as litter picks/ plastic bottle collections to help tackle an issue.
- Written and performed a speech about your issue. (You could record this and put it online!)
- Produced a PowerPoint presentation with information about your issue that can be shared with others.
- Used websites like www.canva.com to produce professional looking posters, leaflets and logos.

Remember this is only a plan – you can think about doing things outside of your house (even if you can't do those things at the moment.) Try and make sure at least two of your ideas are things that you could do from home. 😊
